Microsuction Ear wax removal

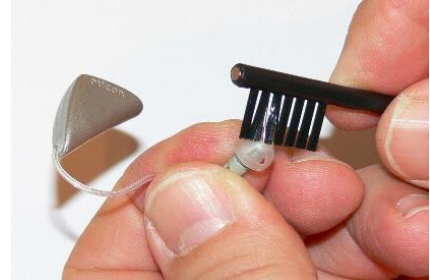


Our Advice on Hearing Aid Care and Maintenance

1: Be certain to contact your insurance company as soon as you get home to place your hearing aid on your policy

2: Keep your hearing aids as free from wax as possible, you can do this by:

- Having regular ear wax removal- We recommend either once or twice a year, however some may need their ears suctioned more frequently
- Ensure the vents are open and kept free of wax using your cleaning brush
- Change the wax filters frequently (if your advice has them)
- Regularly clean the mould with small alcohol wipes



3: Avoid your hearing aids coming into contact with either hair spray or makeup as this clogs the microphone

4: Store your hearing aid(s) in a safe and dry place

- Remove the batteries and place hearing aid(s) in a dry aid box when not in use
- Remove the hearing aids from your ears before showering, swimming, or exercising

5: Keep your hearing aids out of reach from young children and pets

- Young children may swallow the battery or damage the hearing aid
- Pets are often attracted to the scent of their owner and may chew on device

6: Remember your Audiologists are always there to help you with your hearing aid(s)

- It may take a few visits to have a suitable adjustment for the fit or sound
- Visit your audiologist at least once a year to test your hearing and adjust your device

7: Always have any repairs carried out by a specialist



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
